Does your commercial building project include equipment that may be subject to air pollution control regulations?

EXAMPLE: Diesel engines, boilers, incinerators, and paint booths are just a few of the types of equipment that can be subject to these regulations.

Air quality regulations require that anyone proposing to install such equipment that meets certain criteria must obtain a construction approval or permit from the Kansas Department of Health and Environment prior to the initiation of construction for the facility.
